Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. (MGC) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization with 6,530 Members in 174 Clubs. MGC is a Member of National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) with nearly 190,000 Members and is part of their Central Region (CR). In addition, there are inter-national affiliates making NGC the largest garden related volunteer organization in the world.



Founded in 1931, MGC had its origin in the Ann Arbor Garden Club who felt that a state federation in a national organization would exert more influence to conserve

and protect our state's beauty and improve the quality of member's gardens. Forty representatives from fifteen known Garden Clubs of Michigan joined together. It is through their wisdom, foresight and efforts that policies and objectives which were established remain the foundation as we know it today.
