If you really want to cultivate the plants above, what can you do to protect them from deer?

Spray: deer repellants such as Liquid Fence, Deer Away, Deer Out, Plantskydd, or Deer Off or home-brewed mixtures containing rotten eggs, hot sauce, or garlic.

Hang: mesh bags of strong-smelling soap or commercial products such as Green Screen.

Scatter: powders such as Green Screen, Plantskydd, or Plant Saver

Fence: with a 6' to 8' fence or an electric fence.

Apply netting or burlap: Make sure it's strong enough so that the deer can't chew through it.

Install motion activated sprinklers to scare the deer.

Get a dog: Make sure it's large enough not to be intimidated by the deer and trainable to keep out of your flower beds.

Give up sleeping: Go outside and patrol your plants 24/7.
