2009 State Convention: Kalamazoo, MI, June 2-3, Theme: "Creating Beauty" Installation year. Norma Stancati and Phyllis Straw Co-Chaired the 78th Annual Convention "Creating Beauty" held at the Radisson Plaza Hotel and Suites in Kalamazoo, presiding was our current MGC President, Dolores Stouwie. Central Region Director, Joan Hood was our guest.

A walking tour through historic Kalamazoo was offered and a docent-guided tour of Georgia O'Keefe's paintings at the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts. Workshops were provided by Pauline Flynn, NGC Accredited Master Judge,

former MGC District Director, and Arts & Craft Chairman, on how to make contrived flowers from natural materials. 'Easy Orchids' expert Rob Halgren, spoke

on how to grow orchids. Photographer Dean Pennala shared his skills on how to capture beauty in photographing flowers, gardens and the details of nature. Potter and gardener, Cleve Hayes, discussed planting techniques, and tell us the history and botany of sedums. Wildlife Recovery Association's Joe Rogers, spoke about the importance of birds of prey and their rehabilitation. In the evening, after the reception honoring the organization's leadership, the new MGC officers were installed by Sharon Yantis and Lyn Butus, former MGC State Presidents, followed by an Afterglow reception. James Bridenstine, Executive Director of the Kalamazoo Institute of Art, 'Something is Blooming in Kalamazoo,' provided an overview of the exhibit of works by Georgia O'Keefe. Our featured luncheon speaker, author and distinguished garden designer, Pam Duthie, spoke on how to bring continuous color into our gardens. Other speakers included: MGC Webmaster Valfrid Dinvald hosted a workshop on using the MGC Website, and Cleve Hayes will repeat his Monday workshop. The conference closes on a high note with our dinner speaker Dorothy Hochmuth, local floral designer, who shared many outstanding designs.

Achievements:

I especially want to thank my Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. Board Members for being an amazing team. I am deeply appreciative of all the help I received from many Board and club members throughout this great state and organization.

This President's Project supported the Loda Lake Wildflower Sanctuary, the only state wildflower preserve associated with the US Forest Service in the Nation, in their efforts to construct a pavilion for the sanctuary through the sale of Michigan Garden Clubs logo (Spirit Wear) merchandise and donations. Our efforts were achieved and our goal reached more than \$20,000 raised for this project. The sale of Spirit Wear merchandise having the MGC logo served two purposes: 1) a means of promoting Michigan Garden Clubs name throughout the state; and 2) a means of establishing a common goal in which every member could participate to provide a pavilion at the wildflower sanctuary for outdoor classes to be held. I'm pleased to say that the enthusiasm for this project continued into the next presidency, Nancy Stark's term, and grew to establish a Loda Lake Fund at the Freemont Area Community Foundation to continue this legacy.

Because Michigan has many established members not able to dig in the dirt, another goal was to request members to read garden related books to the children in their communities and then donate those books to their local library; More than 575 garden related books were donated. This was a project that benefitted two generations and another organization – our public libraries and schools in Michigan.

Our "new" Website has been operational since December of 2007. It has grown enormously thanks to our new website and web master, Valfrid Dinvald. We can all access valuable information in many content areas. There are areas exclusively for members and others for the public to view more about MGC. There are links to other Garden Clubs in Michigan, National Garden Clubs and Central Region plus related gardening sites. The public areas were designed to give the visitor an idea of what the organization is about, so they can explore their interests further through one of our member clubs. The member only areas were designed to provide club leadership information that is helpful to all MGC clubs. The site continued to change as new material was presented that is of interest to members or the general public. It is a vehicle for up-to-date communication for our membership and potential new members. Michigan Garden Clubs' Board is grateful to Edna Rosenfield for her generous gift through her Trust Fund. It was decided to utilize the gift for the benefit of many and especially to those interested in joining a garden club. Our investment in the Website is intended to honor Edna for her generosity.

MGC was fortunate to have a professional and highly qualified member, Ester Lamb, establish a database for Michigan Garden Clubs membership records and then proceed to create a Yahoo Newsletter Group so our members, if they desire, could receive the state publication, *Thru the Garden Gate* via email. A Database Committee was established to assist with the many facets of this project. Tables / Queries were created to provide, with a click of the mouse, various types of information related to the database. Security for this information was high on our priority list and this has been address by the Database Manager.

With the assistance of our MGC Board members, our official MGC Handbook and Bylaws were revisited, updated, and printed. These were huge projects and thanks to our chairmen, Marge McGoff and Florence Smith (both former MGC State Presidents) we were able to complete and issue the handbook and Bylaws in 2010. Deannie Picciotti played a significant role as scribe for these projects.

MGC has presented more than 56 Life Memberships and three National Garden Club Life Memberships since June 2009. Over 94% of Michigan garden clubs participated and promoted civic beautification within their communities and have incorporated more than 64,217 daffodils in support of "Golden Days" and this president's "Yellow Ribbons of Color" projects.

Collections were taken at the District Meetings for the "Memorial Garden for the Fallen" at Dover Air Force Base. Many of our garden clubs and individuals gave donations, which totaled more than \$7,000 by Michigan Garden Club members. Our Michigan Garden Clubs - History 2009-2011: Lynn Dinvald, MGC President 2

members truly opened their hearts and pocketbooks for this heartwarming project sponsored by the Delaware Federated Garden Clubs. We can do wonderful things as a dedicated group of unified members.

Our "Retention and Recruitment" membership campaign, spearheaded by Nancy Stark First Vice President, provided many new members and six new garden clubs from 2009-2011. Three districts, one garden council affiliated with 12 MGC garden clubs. and many individual clubs throughout the state, held flower shows during this president's term. Youth garden clubs in Michigan are learning about beautification, conservation and have plant school gardens. Community gardens continue to grow in popularity with many MGC clubs sponsoring programs and support for project in their areas.

Jean Moran and Pauline Flynn exhibited in the competitive classes while Marge McGoff and Nancy Passfield serve on judging panels for the flower show.

The seven Districts' of Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. placed their 50th Blue Star Memorial marker at Fort Custer National Cemetery, May 24, 2010 and were honored to have Renee Blaschke, NGC President, participate in our dedication. This was the first Blue Star Memorial Marker to be placed in a National Cemetery. Lorrie Dyal was the Blue Star Chairman for Michigan who enthusiastically promoted this project.
